Defining Community Outreach & Engagement

...the process of working collaboratively with and through groups of people affiliated by geographic proximity, special interest, or similar situations to address issues affecting the wellbeing of those people. Community engagement involves those affected in understanding the risks they face, and involves them in response actions that are acceptable.

Framing COE & Cancer Health

Cancer Centers – working with community stakeholders – should identify community needs, communicate those needs across the Center's leadership and research programs (i.e., "in-reach"), and catalyze activities of special relevance to the Cancer Center's self-defined geographic catchment area population.

Centers are expected to work with communities to disseminate and implement evidence-based interventions (EBIs) and guidelines, public education, and public health policy recommendations.



UW Carbone's COE Mission and Vision

Our mission is to reduce the burden of cancer and cancer health disparities through impactful population science research integrated with community outreach and engagement across Wisconsin spanning prevention to the end of life. We envision conducting the research, and community outreach and engagement, essential for defeating cancer and achieving health equity across Wisconsin and around the world.



Cancer Health Disparities Initiative

The Mission of the Cancer Health Disparities Initiative (CHDI) is to partner with communities, UW and Carbone Cancer Center faculty to reduce inequities in cancer burden through research, outreach, education, and training.
